Academic & Classroom Activities

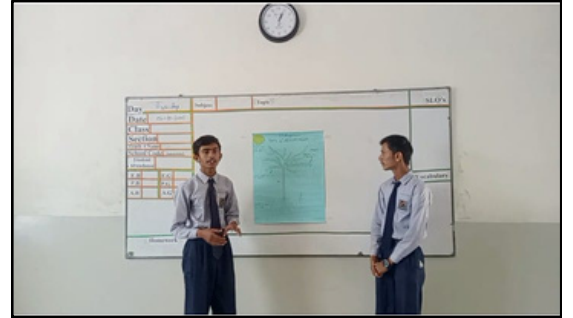
Science Laboratory Activities

Students conducted hands-on science activities using pH paper to identify the acidity and basicity of substances, while also learning about human and plant body parts through practical demonstrations. These activities enhanced students' understanding of basic science concepts and strengthened their analytical, observational, and curiosity-driven learning skills.



Student Presentation

Students confidently presented the topic Photosynthesis, explaining how plants prepare food using sunlight, water, carbon dioxide, and chlorophyll, while releasing oxygen. The presentation highlighted the importance of photosynthesis in sustaining life and maintaining ecological balance, while improving students' communication and confidence.
